Sadly, this will be the final newsletter of the University Arts Women's Club-University of Toronto Women's Association, bringing to a close an organization that provided activities and friendship for many during its 95 years – it has had a good run!

The club's final event was the Spring Luncheon and Annual General Meeting held April 18 in the Main Lounge of The Faculty Club, University of Toronto. 42 members and guests gathered together to share a delicious meal and enjoy the traditional camaraderie of our club. The University of Toronto Press continued their tradition of donating books, this year generously providing one for each attendee.

All relevant offices and committees at the university have been notified of our closing, and we received a lovely letter from President Gertler acknowledging our many years of contribution to the university.

Our possessions have all been rehomed, with the engraved silver pieces being donated to the Office of the President of the University of Toronto, and many items going to Bloor Street United Church and others to several of our members.

Documents for UAWC, UTWA and UAWC-UTWA have been sent to the University of Toronto Archives and Records Management Services (UTARMS). These submissions consist of paper copies of various reports, minutes, publications, etc. as well as electronic copies of newer records. UTARMS has already uploaded our website to their digital archives although it will be available on the internet for the rest of the summer.

Various non-essential and duplicate documents were shredded to maintain confidentiality of the information they contained.

While culling material for submission to UTARMS it was discovered that 2 copies of our first History Book (1929-1974) were submitted to the National Library of Canada (now Library and Archives Canada (LAC)) in 1979. Although searchable in the electronic database they cannot be read online; one must travel to Ottawa and request a copy be retrieved for viewing.

LAC was approached to see if they were interested in the subsequent instalments of our history, Books 2 (1975-1999), 3 (2000-2020) and 4 (2020-2024) and after being satisfied that these publications met their criteria, they accepted the donation. A hard copy of each

booklet has been sent to their Gifts Section in Gatineau, Quebec.

The bank account was closed just before our year end, June 30, 2024, and a copy of the final Financial Report is at the end of this newsletter.

After all expenses were paid, we were able to donate \$3,000 to the Division of University Advancement (DUA), University of Toronto, to be used for scholarships. DUA reported that this year 20 students received financial assistance from UTWA's contributions, and 418 have received support since inception of the awards. As noted previously, UTWA's Scholarships and Bursaries will continue to be administered in perpetuity by the university.

Thank you to Sue Russell who researched our recent documents and compiled the fourth instalment of our history. A copy of this has been emailed to each member, and posted to our website:
